












Polycarp

- Bishop of the church at Smyrna
 - Known for his martyrdom in Smyrna


Polycarp

Author of a letter to the church at Philippi

- "The Martyrdom of Polycarp"
 - Letter composed by the church of Smyrna shortly after Polycarp's death and sent to the church at Philomelium

Polycarp

- Regarded as one of the most influential church leaders of the 2nd century ad
- Lived at a time when the church was transitioning from apostolic leadership to having church leaders who were not eyewitnesses of Jesus



"He would speak of his familiar communion with John, and with the rest of the those who had seen the Lord; and how he would call their words to remembrance. Whatsoever things he had heard from them respecting the Lord, both with regard to His miracles and His teaching, Polycarp having thus received it from the eye-witnesses of the the Word of life, would recount them all in harmony with the Scriptures."

-Irenaeus (130-202 ad)

Letter to the church at Philippi

- A response to the church's requests...
 - Theological explanation concerning righteousness
 - Church discipline
- Also included copies of the works of Ignatius (bishop at Antioch)

Letter to the church at Philippi

- Polycarp derived his teachings from:
- 1) Words of the Lord

(Known as a "conservative traditionalist" of what had been handed down from Jesus)

2) Old Testament writings

(Psalms, Proverbs, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel)

3) Apostolic Writings

17 of 27 books in N.T.

"The Martyrdom of Polycarp"

- 1st recorded martyrdom in post New Testament history
- Believed to be composed by eyewitnesses
- Likely written between 155-160 ad

Circumstances Polycarp lived in...

 First 40 years the infant church spread at a phenomenal rate!





Reasons for the gospel's spread:

- Early Christians were moved by a burning conviction.
- The practical expression of Christian love was probably among the most powerful causes of Christian success.
- persecution in many instances helped to publicize the Christian faith.

Acts 1:8 (NKJV)

But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

"witness"

μάρτυς - (martys)

- one who declares, or can declare, what he himself has seen or heard or knows
- · 'one who testifies for one'
- to be a witness for one, serve him by testimony



- The main cause of the hatred of early Christians in Roman society lies in their distinctive life-style.
- The word used to describe the Christian in the New Testament is highly significant.
 - It is the term <u>hagios</u>, often translated "<u>saints</u>." It means holy ones, but its root suggests <u>different</u>.

- The supreme cause of Roman persecution of Christians arose from the tradition of <u>EMPEROR WORSHIP</u>.
- because of Roman peace pax Romana
- There was a deep and heartfelt gratitude to the spirit of Rome
- the human mind and heart need a symbol so...
- The emperor embodied Rome; he was Rome; in him the spirit of Rome resided and had its earthly dwelling.

- One had to burn a pinch of incense and say, "Ceasar is Lord"
- He could then go and worship any god he liked
- This was primarily a test of political loyalty
- If a man refused, he was branded as a traitor and revolutionary
- To a Christian, Jesus Christ is Lord and He alone!

So Polycarp would be martyred...




